### **PE Kits**

Children should have a pair of pumps or training shoes for outdoor games lessons. Many children also wear dark coloured, plain tracksuits for outdoor games.

If you wish your child to wear stud ear-rings please ensure they are able to remove the earrings themselves for PE lessons.

We are so excited to launch The Book Swap: Share the Magic! program here at school. It's a fun way for our students to keep their reading journeys fresh and exciting. Our goal is to make sustainability natural part of the daily school routine while fostering long-term reading habits. We want every child to feel the excitement of a fresh book without the need for constant new purchases.

Here is how your child can participate:

- **Leave One, Take One:** Your child can bring in a book from home that they've already finished and no longer need. They can swap it for another book from our Swap Box.
- **No Book? No Problem!** If your child doesn't have a book to swap but is eager to read, our reading ambassadors will be randomly selecting pupils and giving out **Golden Tokens** that allows them to pick out a book from the Book Swap.
